

Registration Process and Schedule for the On-Campus Residence Halls, Suites and Apartments For the Fall 2009 - Spring 2010 Academic Year

Who is Eligible to Participate?

To be eligible to participate in the registration process for URI's Residence Halls, Suites or Apartments for the fall 2009 – spring 2010 academic year, students must be one of the following:

- An occupant of one of these residences for the spring 2009 semester. The exception to this rule is for those occupants who were assigned to one of these residence for the Spring 2009 semester but who were not an occupant of one of these residences for the fall 2008 semester, or
- An occupant of one of these residences for the spring 2008 semester who is on “exchange” for both the fall 2008 and spring 2009 semesters, or
- An occupant of one of these residences for the fall 2008 semester who is on “exchange” for the spring 2009 semester, only

Registration Process for Exchange Students

Fall 2008 semester occupants of one of these residences who are on exchange for the spring 2009 semester, and who are seeking housing in these residences for the fall 2009 – spring 2010 academic year must complete, or must have a proxy complete for them, all four steps of the housing registration process for next year. All housing registration policies and deadlines apply when using a proxy.

Spring 2009 semester occupants of one of these residences who will be on National or International Exchange for the fall 2009 semester, and who are seeking housing in these residences for the spring 2010 semester should complete step 1 and step 3 of the registration process. They will be assigned to a room on a space available basis in January of 2010 and will be provided their room, building and roommate information at that time. These residents should indicate in the Student Comments portion of their Housing Application “exchange fall 2009 - require housing spring 2010”.

Who is Not Eligible to Participate?

Students who are not eligible to participate in the Registration Process for URI's Residence Halls, Suites or Apartments for the fall 2009 – spring 2010 academic year include those students who, for the spring 2009 semester: lived in a URI Transfer House, commuted from home, lived off-campus, lived in Greek Housing or who did not live in the one of these residences for the fall 2008 semester and were newly assigned to one of these residences for the spring 2009 semester. Also not eligible to participate in the registration process are those students who will be transferring to URI for the fall 2009 semester from other institutions, including CCRI and CCE in Providence.

Upper Classmen Living and Learning Communities

Spring 2009 occupants of the Residence Halls, Suites or Apartments who meet the eligibility requirements outlined above and who would like to reside in the Athletics, CELS, Health Science or Honors LLC for upper classmen for the fall 2009 – spring 2010 academic year should contact that LLC's administrative office for information on their registration process. Please note that students who will reside in an LLC in one of the Residence Halls, Suites or Apartments must submit a completed Housing Application and a \$200 non-refundable Housing Deposit (if applicable) by the end of business on March 25, 2009 at the location specified in Step 3 of the registration instructions in this document. These students can obtain a Housing Application from the LLC's administrative office or from their hall's administrative office.

Registration Process and Schedule

Step 1: Obtain Housing Application and Instructions February 17 – February 24

All residents who are Full Scholarship Athletes must obtain their Housing Application and Instructions from their team's administrative office. All other residents including residents who have applied to be an RA for the fall 2009 – spring 2010 academic year, Partial Scholarship Athletes and residents who are members of the Talent Development Program can obtain their Housing Application and Instructions from their residence hall's office.

Step 2: Evaluate Building Options February 25 – March 1

Residents should evaluate the four on-campus building options that are available to returning undergraduate residents and identify those buildings that they like best, and those for which they meet the occupancy requirements. Please see the section in this document describing the four building options. Finally, depending on the building and room style desired, residents may need to choose their roommates, suitemates or apartment-mates for next year, at this time. In the event a resident's first choice of building and room is unavailable, they should be prepared to make an alternative selection. The more residents know about the various building options, the more likely they will be to select a room that best meets their needs. Step 3: Submit Housing Application and Pay a \$200 Non-Refundable Housing Deposit, and Complete Your Meal Plan Application Online March 2 – March 25

All residents who are Full Scholarship Athletes, including those who have applied to be an RA for next year, must submit their completed housing application to their team's administrative office by the end of business on March 25th. All residents who are in the Talent Development Program, including those who have applied to be an RA for next year, must submit their completed housing application in room 107 of the Roger Williams Building by the end of business on March 25th. All other residents, including Partial Scholarship Athletes and those residents who have applied to be an RA for next year, must submit a completed Housing Application and a \$200 non-refundable Housing Deposit in person to Enrollment Services located in Green Hall by the end of business on March 25th. Deposits and Applications submitted through any other means than those outlined above will not be processed. Checks should be made payable to The University of Rhode Island. Eligible residents who miss the Application and Deposit deadline of March 25, 2009 will not be allowed to participate in Standard Room Registration and as a result will not receive on-campus housing for the fall 2009- spring 2010 academic year. Please note, the \$200 Housing Deposit is non-refundable.

Step 4: Register for a Room April 6 – April 23

All eligible residents who met the Housing Application and Housing Deposit deadline of March 25, 2009, including Full Scholarship Athletes, Partial Scholarship Athletes and members of the Talent Development Program must register for a room, in person or through a proxy, for the fall 2009- spring 2010 academic year on the date and at the time specified for Room Registration. Complete instructions for Room Registration have been included in this document. Residents who have not registered for a room in person or by proxy by 8:00 pm

on the final posted day for Room Registration will both forfeit their \$200 housing deposit and will be deemed ineligible for on-campus housing in the Residence Halls, Suites and Apartments for the fall 2009 – spring 2010 academic year.

Room Registration Dates and Times

Room Registration

April 6 – April 23 (tentative dates)

final dates will be posted on April 1st)

Each eligible resident, who met the Housing Application and Housing Deposit deadline, will be randomly assigned a time on April 7th – April 23rd during which they can register for their chosen room, if available, in person or by proxy. In addition to the registration time, residents will be assigned a registration number. Their registration number represents the order in which each resident with the same registration time will register for a room. Each eligible resident's assigned registration time and number will be posted on the web at <http://housing.uri.edu> on Wednesday April 1st, 2009. Room Registration will be held on the second floor of the Roger Williams building.

Residents may register for a room as an individual or as a roommate pair. In addition, residents may register as a group, but they must select contiguous rooms within the same suite or apartment. Further, the residents being registered at one registration time must be for the same suite or apartment, and the number of residents being registered cannot exceed the standard capacity of that suite or apartment. Please consult building floor plans at <http://housing.uri.edu> for the room configuration of the specific suite, apartment or hallway of interest.

Residents may register at their assigned registration time or at their roommate's, suitemates or apartment-mates assigned registration time, whichever is earliest. In these instances, the resident with the earlier registration time of the pair or earliest registration time of the group must attend registration at their posted registration time. The attending resident must present their valid URI ID card as well as a printed list containing, in alphabetical order, the Last Name, First Name, URI ID # and cell phone # of the other eligible residents who they will register. Residents may also have a proxy register for them. The proxy must present their valid URI ID and the valid URI ID of the resident who they are representing, at that resident's assigned registration time. In the case of group registration, the proxy must also present the list of other residents who they will be registering with the required resident information. To minimize delays during Room Registration, residents who are registering as a group, are asked to have no more than two members of their group attend registration at their assigned registration time. Also, residents who are registering as a group are responsible for ensuring that all the members of their group are eligible to participate in the Registration Process. So, be certain to have each member of your group provide evidence that they are eligible to participate in the Registration Process or your group will not be allowed to register for your selected room, suite or apartment.

Individual residents as well as those with roommates, suitemates or apartment-mates may register for rooms, (including single rooms), suites or apartments in: Aldrich, Burnside, Coddington, Dorr, Eddy, Ellery, Hopkins, Garrahy and Wiley. Please note that only those residents who will be a junior or a senior next year are eligible to register for the Garrahy and Wiley Apartments. In addition, residents may register for any available single room in Hutchinson, Merrow, Peck and Tucker Halls. However, only individual residents may register for the single rooms in Hutchinson, Merrow, Peck and Tucker Halls and they may register for only one room at their assigned registration time. Due to very high demand for on-campus housing, residents with the latest assigned registration times may not be allowed to register for a room for themselves, but will be assigned through the Summer Registration Program and will receive their room and roommate information during the summer of 2009.

Building Options, Occupancy Requirements & Costs

Garrahy Hall and Wiley Hall - Apartments

Capacity: 418 residents. Cost: 4-single bedroom Apt. with two bathrooms \$3957 each resident; 5-single bedroom Apt. with two bathrooms \$3899 each resident; per semester and all utilities as well as air conditioning are included. Parking is available in the Flagg Road lot as well as in other resident lots. URI parking permit required. The bedrooms and living rooms of these co-ed apartments are completely furnished. The kitchen in each apartment is equipped with a full size stove and oven, full size refrigerator, microwave oven and a dishwasher. It is for this reason that residents of the apartments are not required to purchase a University meal plan. Residents must be juniors through 6th year seniors and residents may stay in their apartments during all of the, inter and intra semester breaks. Residents can be assigned to an apartment in a group equal to the capacity of the unit, as a group that is less than the capacity of the unit, or as individuals. If you need additional roommates, check out the roommate bulletin board located in room 107 of the Roger Williams Building.

Eddy Hall - Suites

Capacity: 290 residents, Cost: 5-single bedroom suite with two bathrooms \$3776, each resident; 10-single bedroom suite with three bathrooms \$3689, each resident; 6-resident two triple bedroom suite with two bathrooms \$3023, each resident; per semester and all utilities as well as air conditioning are included. Parking is available in the Keaney Lot and a URI parking permit is required. These are co-ed suites in which the bedrooms as well as the living rooms are completely furnished. Residents must be sophomores through 6th year seniors. Residents of Eddy Hall are required to have a University resident meal plan. Residents can be assigned to suites in groups equal to the capacity of the unit, as a group that is less than the capacity of the unit, or as individuals. If you need additional roommates, check out the roommate bulletin board located in room 107 of the Roger Williams building.

Four Double Bedroom and Four or Five Single Bedroom - Suites

Capacity: 200+ residents per building. Cost: Triple \$2394 each resident; Double \$2817 each resident and Single \$2971 each resident; per semester. These buildings offer co-ed suites, with four double bedrooms for eight residents that share two private bathrooms. There are also a limited number of suites with four or five single bedrooms that share one bathroom and are not co-ed. These buildings provide a great opportunity for a group of friends to share a semi-private suite of rooms with an adjoining public area. All halls are located adjacent to the Roger Williams building. Halls include: Aldrich, Burnside, Coddington, Dorr, Ellery and Hopkins.

Small Corridor - Residence Hall

Capacity: 125 residents per building. Cost: Single \$3245 per resident; per semester. These residences were renovated in 2007 and have traditional corridor style double and single rooms with shared hallway bathrooms. The single rooms only will be available to upper classmen as freshmen will reside in the double rooms. For this reason this building is not eligible for group assignment and each resident may only register for a single room for themselves. Halls include: Hutchinson, Peck, Merrow and Tucker. All these halls have a very convenient location right across from the library and next door to Hope Commons Dining Hall. These halls are great for residents looking to meet new friends.

***Prices quoted are semester estimates for the 2009-2010 academic year and all residents will be assessed a \$266 technology fee per semester**
